Background Information:

City Council adopted Resolution No. 68 creating the Westminster YAP on September 13, 1999. The YAP is made up of representatives from grades eight through 12 from local area schools as well as at-large members home-schooled within the City of Westminster. Their purpose is to advise City Council and Staff on the interests and concerns of youth and teens in the city. These matters include development of community and/or neighborhood programs that address both the short- and long-term needs of Westminster's youth and teen population.

The term of each panelist is one year, with reappointment possible each year. In addition to advising City leaders, each panelist gives back to the community by taking part in community service events, assisting with City events, and engaging in other projects.

The YAP has been helpful in assisting the City of Westminster with the Holiday Lighting Ceremony as well as providing feedback to employees from all over the City, including the Police Department; Fire Department; Parks, Recreation, Open Space, and Libraries Advisory Board; City Manager's Office; and more. Through various activities, the YAP members have fulfilled their goal of making a difference in the places where they attend school and live.

This City Council action supports the City's Strategic Plan goal of Community Empowerment and Engagement by recognizing and supporting the efforts of the youth who give back to their community.
