Recommended City Council Action:

Accept the Fourth Quarter 2022 Insurance Claims Report.

Summary Statement:

The attached report provides detailed information on each liability insurance claim made to the City including the City's claim number, date of loss, claimant's name and address, a summary of the claim, and the claim's status. Since all claims represent a potential liability to the City, Risk Management Staff works closely with the City Attorney's Office on litigated claims to consider the interests of the City and our residents. The listing of the claims in this report is provided in accordance with Westminster Municipal Code 1-30-3.

In accordance with Westminster Municipal Code provisions, the Risk Manager, acting as the City Manager's designee, has the authority to settle claims of less than \$30,000. However, under the City's contract with the Colorado Intergovernmental Risk Sharing Agency (CIRSA), CIRSA acts as the City's claims adjustor and settlement of claims proceeds with the concurrence of both CIRSA and the Risk Manager. The City retains the authority to reject any settlement recommended by CIRSA but does so at the risk of waiving its insurance coverage for such claims.
