

SENATE BILL 23-034: Official City Position

Approved by Westminster City Council on February XX, 2023

SENATORS FIELDS, PELTON, B., et al; REPRESENTATIVES EVANS, McLACHLAN

Concerning the definition of serious bodily injury in section 18-1-901, Colorado Revised Statutes.

Official City Position: SUPPORT

<u>Status</u>: Active - This bill was introduced in the House on January 10, 2023. It was assigned to the Judiciary Committee for hearing on February 6, 2023. On February 10, 2023 it successfully passed out of the Senate and was introduced in the House the same day.

<u>Description (after Senate amendments)</u>

The bill amends the definition of "serious bodily injury" to include:

- Bodily injury that, either at the time of the actual injury or at a later time, involves a substantial risk specifically associated with the type of injury sustained by the victim or intended by the perpetrator;
- Firearm Penetrating gunshot wounds; or
- Knife Penetrating knife wounds.

This legislation is in alignment with the following principle(s) as set forth in the City's <u>2023</u> <u>Legislative Policy Statement</u>:

Public Safety:

Supports legislation that provides resources and support to all victims of crimes, particularly violent crimes, to include domestic violence.

This bill amends the definition of "Serious Bodily Injury" (SBI) to include wounds caused by a firearm, knife, and second- and third-degree burns.
