Summary Statement:

- National Public Works Week is a celebration of the tens of thousands of men and women across the United States who provide and maintain the infrastructure and services collectively known as Public Works.
- The American Public Works Association and State Chapters dedicate the third week in May each year to inform and educate the community of the importance of Public Works. The theme of this year's Public Works Week is "Connecting the World".

Background Information:

Public Works professionals throughout the United States and Canada will celebrate National Public Works Week, May 21 through May 27, 2023.

Since 1960, the annual observance has been an opportunity to increase public awareness of the role Public Works plays in all of our daily lives. The week seeks to enhance awareness and understanding of the important role of the often-unsung heroes of our society – the professionals who serve the public wellbeing every day with quiet dedication, including the more than 150 dedicated employees in the City's Public Works and Utilities Department.

Through National Public Works Week, the Colorado Chapter of the American Public Works Association seeks to raise public awareness of public works issues and to increase confidence in Public Works employees who are dedicated to improving the quality of life for present and future generations.
