Recommended City Council Action:

1. Hold a public meeting on the City of Westminster Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Application and receive comment from the public.
2. Authorize the Mayor to execute a written certification in support of the City's application for the 2023 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program.

Summary Statement:

- The Police Department (PD) is applying for the Fiscal Year 2023 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program local solicitation. The grant application process was announced June 30, 2023, and per the guidelines, only units of local government such as municipalities may apply.
- The application is not considered complete until the Chief Executive of their respective city, defined as the Mayor by the grant application, properly executes, signs, and submits a written certification making certain assurances on behalf of their city.
- A requirement of the grant is that the application is submitted for review by the governing body for a period not less than 30 days before the date of the Mayor's certification and the respective city certifies that it provided an opportunity to its residents to comment on the application.

- The PD is requesting \$34,322 from this grant program for training and the purchase of associated equipment, supplies, and software capabilities for digital forensic analyses.

Fiscal Impact:

\$34,322 in grant expenditures if awarded

Source of Funds:

2023 Edward Byrne Memorial JAG Program to be included at a future budget supplemental appropriation after grant award funds are received.

Policy Issue(s):

Should City Council authorize the Mayor to execute a written certification in support of the City's application for the Edward Byrne Memorial JAG Program thereby allowing Staff to complete the grant application process and utilize the grant funds in the amount of \$34,322?

Alternative(s):

City Council could not choose to authorize the Mayor to execute a written certification of the City's application for the Edward Byrne.

Background Information:

The Edward Byrne Memorial JAG Program is the primary provider of federal criminal justice funding to states and units of local governments by assisting them with critical funding necessary to support wide range of program areas within law enforcement. In 2023, the City is eligible for the allocated amount of \$34,322 from the grant program.

The grant application process for the 2023 grant program was announced on June 30, 2023, with an application deadline of August 31, 2023. Based on both the grant guidance, and the City's internal Grant Guidance, Policies and Procedures, the PD submitted the application prior to the deadline with the understanding that if the certification is not authorized by City Council, the PD would withdraw the grant application. In addition, the granting agency could place a contingency on the grant funds until the requirements of the grant are fulfilled.

The application is not considered complete until the Chief Executive of the City, defined as the Mayor by the grant guidance and application, properly executes and signs the document attached to the grant application referred to as the "Certifications and Assurances by the Chief Executive of the Applicant Government" (Certification) for submittal. A copy of the application and Certification is attached to this agenda memorandum (Attachment A).

In addition to a number of certifications and assurances contained within the Certification, there are several requirements one of which is that the grant application is submitted for review by the governing body for a period not less than 30 days before the date of the Mayor's Certification. Another requirement is that the City certify that it provided an opportunity to its residents to comment on the application and this agenda memorandum serves as such notification. The public will have the opportunity to comment on the application during the City Council meeting at which time City Council considers the requested action. Staff has reviewed all of the certifications, assurances, and requirements set forth in the Certification and represents to the Mayor and City Council that the City has met these requirements.

The PD is requesting the 2023 Edward Byrne Memorial JAG Program allocation of \$34,322 for training and the purchase of associated equipment, supplies, and software that will provide the capability for digital forensic analyses of digital cell phones and digital electronic devices, such as computers and/or laptops by identifying, acquiring, processing, and reporting data electronically. It will enable Staff to effectively and efficiently perform digital forensic analyses, which has a direct impact on internet crimes against children as well as other online threats to victims of all ages.

The 2023 Edward Byrne Memorial JAG Program funding supports the City's Strategic Plan of a Proactive Public Safety to enhance public safety to emphasize both prevention and enforcement, engage the community through education and outreach and provide resources necessary to ensure safety and well-being throughout Westminster by seeking and applying for grant funding.

PROPOSAL NARRATIVE

The City of Westminster (City), Colorado, was incorporated in 1911. It serves a population of 118,940 and covers 34 square miles. The City is a suburban community located in both Adams and Jefferson County. The Police Department's (PD) role is to enforce the law in a fair and impartial manner, recognizing both the statutory and judicial limitations of police authority and the constitutional rights of all persons and to prevent and deter crime, apprehend offenders, recovery and return of property and the effective movement of traffic. The PD has 199 authorized sworn police officers and 89.3 authorized non-sworn (civilians) for a total of 288.3 fulltime employees.

Description of the Issues

The City is applying for the 2023 Edward Byrne Memorial (EBM) Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program in the amount of \$34,322 for a Law Enforcement Digital Forensic Project. These grant funds will provide for the purchase of needed training, equipment, supplies and software capabilities for analyzing digital cell phones and digital electronic devices, such as computers and/or laptops, by identifying, acquiring, processing and reporting on data stored electronically. It will enable the assigned Detectives/Officers to effectively and efficiently perform these digital forensic analyses, which have a direct impact on internet crimes against children as well as other online threats to victims of all ages. It is crucial for law enforcement. To date, our agency's current equipment and software capabilities for analyzing digital cell phones and digital electronic devices is not sufficient enough to adequately perform these analyses.

As a result of the everyday Operations Budget of the PD, we are unable to purchase needed training, equipment, supplies and software without the assistance of grant funding.

PROPOSAL NARRATIVE

This project will address the JAG Goals and Objectives of training and purchasing the necessary equipment, supplies and software; thus, allowing for successfully locating and prosecuting the suspect/offender and decreasing the number of internet crimes against persons.

Investigative Services, will oversee the project. Assigned personnel will work closely with the vendor(s) and pertinent City Staff to ensure that the training, equipment, supplies and software are successfully in place. The local community will not be a participant of the planning process due to the ease of implementation.

PROPOSAL NARRATIVE

The City understands and is aware that the application is not considered complete until the Chief Executive of the City (the Mayor), properly executes and signs the "Certifications and Assurances by the Chief Executive of the Applicant Government" (Certification) as well as completing the required review by the governing body for a period not less than 30 days before the date the Mayor signs the Certification and that the City certifies that it provided an opportunity to its citizens to comment on the application. The application and the Certification will go before the City of Westminster – City Council on Monday, August 28th, 2023 as an Agenda Memorandum which will also serve as notification to City Council and the public. It is also important to note that the PD responds to mutual aid requests from surrounding jurisdictions, trains with other regional SWAT Teams, executes all North Metro Task Force warrants, collaborates and assists the Colorado Metropolitan Auto Theft Task Force (C-MATT), Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA), Rocky Mountain Safe Streets Task Force (RMSSTF) and is a participant in collaborative trainings with surrounding jurisdictions and the greater Denver Metro area as a participant of the Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI)/North Central Region (NCR) and is active in their Incident Operations Committee as well as the Public Safety and Security and Communication sub-committees where we participate in regional drills.

As an active participant of UASI/NCR we work alongside of other participants/agencies. The NCR is one of nine emergency preparedness and response Regions within the State of Colorado. It is organized around ten counties and their cities, districts, towns and municipalities. As a member, we benefit from agency helping agency, coordinated all-hazards planning, training and exercise efforts. The NCR is also responsible for managing the State Homeland Security Grant

PROPOSAL NARRATIVE

Program of which in the past our agency has been awarded grant funds for equipment and training.

Plan for Collecting the Data:

If successfully awarded the 2023 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant for the City of Westminster Police Department, the Grant Award Administrator will be Jeri Elliott, Contracts and Grant Coordinator, who will complete the required quarterly Performance Reports and the Financial Manager will be Cassandra Adas, Business Operations Coordinator, who will complete the quarterly Financial Reports and the request for drawdown on grant funds.
